Measure "O" – Bond Oversight Committee Update

November 5, 2015

Program Status

- The District's Facilities Assessment and Implementation Plan (Plan) provides specific parameters for the implementation of projects over time
- Phase I is complete
 - ✓ Modernization of Academy and Science Classrooms at Washington and Imperial Middle Schools providing a model of 21st century classrooms
 - ✓ iPads were distributed to over 2,000 students and teachers
 - ✓ Electronic marquees were installed at Washington and Imperial Middle Schools
 - ✓ Courtyard Safety Improvements, including improvements to two courtyards at Imperial Middle School
 - ✓ 21st Century Furnishings were reviewed, tested, selected, and ordered for all of the classroom spaces being modernized at Imperial and Washington Middle Schools, as well as several demonstration spaces
 - ✓ Roofing repairs/replacements at 5 school sites
- Phase II was kicked-off with the completion of a demonstration classroom at Walnut Elementary School, providing a model for future improvements at the site

Program Funding

- In November 2012, District voters approved Measure "O", a \$31 million bond measure to fund improvements as identified in the bond project list and the District's Facilities Assessment and Implementation Plan (Plan)
- Phase I of the Plan includes approximately \$7.9 million in combined funding sources for the improvements at Imperial and Washington middle schools, district-wide roofing and deferred maintenance, and technology
- These combined sources include approximately \$6.3 million in Measure "O" bonds, approximately \$1.2 million in remaining Measure "K" bond funds, and approximately \$500,000 in other district sources
- Phase II of the Program includes approximately \$3.7 million in Measure "O" bonds allocated towards improvements to Walnut Elementary School and district-wide technology
- Future Measure "O" bond sales will be considered when feasible, coordinated with future phases of the Plan

2015 Measure "O" Bond Sale

- In March 2015, the District successfully issued \$3.7 million in Measure "O" GO bonds to fund Phase II of the District's Facilities Assessment and Implementation Plan
- Nixon Peabody served as Bond Counsel; Stifel, Nicolaus & Co. served as Underwriter
- Final terms included:

✓ Amount: \$3.7 Million

✓ Bond Structure: 100% Current Interest Bonds

✓ Final Maturity: August 1, 2039

✓ Term/Length: 24 years

✓ Average Interest Rate: 3.52%

✓ Repayment Ratio: 1.86x

✓ Cost of Issuance: \$147,725

✓ Underwriter Discount: \$18,315
