Formal Call to Order	Board President Ofelia Hanson made the Formal Call to Order at 6:00 p.m.
Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag	Board President Ofelia Hanson asked Elsa Perez to lead the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
Adoption of the Agenda	On a motion made by Emily Pruitt, and a second to the motion made by Adam Rogers, Trustees unanimously adopted the agenda for June 15, 2023.
Adoption of the Minutes of the Regular Meeting	After a motion was made by Sue Pritchard, and a second to the motion made by Emily Pruitt, Sue Pritchard asked that all email correspondence that were sent to the Executive Assistant via email be included as part of the minutes of the May 11, 2023 Board Meeting minutes, similar to past practice. Trustees unanimously approved the minutes of the Regular Meeting of May 11, 2023 and the Special Meeting of June 8, 2023 with amendments.
Correspondence	Twenty-three correspondences were received. Board President Hanson and Vice President Emily Pruitt took turns reading the correspondence. All correspondences are attached.
Public Interest	Superintendent Dr. Mario Carlos administered the Oath of Office to Justin Rodgers as the provisional appointee to the La Habra City School District Board of Trustees. Dr. Sheryl Tecker acknowledged Elsa Alvarez for receiving perfect attendance from kindergarten to 8 th grade. Board Members congratulated Ms. Alvarez on her achievement, dedication, and hard work.
Public Comment	Josh Atwater expressed concern with the provisional appointee interview process. One candidate, in his opinion, stood out because it seemed as though he had access to the questions in advance. He also added he expected to hear deliberations for each candidate and what would make them a good fit. Mr. Atwater indicated he decided against running for the vacancy because he does not represent a majority of the community. Mr. Atwater was shocked there was no mention of PRIDE month in the Diamond Newsletter. The newsletter would have been a good forum for informing parents and families of the District's position in an effort to be inclusive.

	Mr. Atwater stated there are conflicting messages after reading the Kinder Future email. There should be a formal policy to ensure that everyone is made aware of what to anticipate and how it is being communicated.

BUSINESS MATTERS: Public Hearing: Annual Budget for 2023-24	<p>Board President Hanson declared open a public meeting at 6:46 p.m. for comment on the Annual Budget for 2023-24.</p> <p>Assistant Superintendent of Business Services Christeen Betz provided Trustees with an overview of the proposed 2023-24 Annual Budget. The District is reporting a positive certification which indicates the District will meet its obligation for this upcoming year and the two subsequent years. Mrs. Betz reviewed an update on the economy, the May Budget Funding, 2023-24 Budget Assumptions, 2024-24 & 2025-26 Budget Assumptions, Multi-Year Budget (MYB), and the next steps.</p> <p>Mrs. Betz indicated the biggest impact on our budget is the state economy. As of January, the State had a \$22.5 billion deficit and it has grown to a \$31.5 billion deficit as of May. This shortfall equals approximately \$12 billion for K-12 education. At the Governor's May Revision, he highlighted the volatile nature of California state revenues. He indicated there's a decline in the S&P 500, which has significantly impacted the higher income earners, which accounts for over half its total revenue. The decrease is also directly related to interest rate hikes, inflation, bank failures, etc. Additional budget risks include declining enrollment, ADA protection loss, compensation cost pressures, and expiring one-time funds.</p> <p>Mrs. Betz reviewed the budget assumptions for 2023-24 and the subsequent two fiscal years 2024-25 and 2025-26. For the upcoming year, the LHCS D enrollment is</p>

	<p>4,249 which is a decline of 75 and current Average Daily Attendance (ADA) is 4,029. This past year, our ADA rate was at 92%, and prior to COVID it was 97%. Although our ADA is down, this is a trend across the State. Without the ADA we do not get our funding. For 2023-24 we are assuming we are going to be at 95%. Our COLA is assumed at 8.22%. As of now, the State and Legislature are unsure how they are going to fully fund the 8.22%. They can fund approximately 5 ½%, but they are not sure where the remaining 3% will come from. Once a consensus is reached, the District will budget accordingly. Additional factors to consider is the increase in CalSTRS/CalPERS which is approximately \$400K.</p> <p>We currently have a healthy balance for the 2023-24 MYB of \$83 million and \$80 million in expenses. The current committed funds are \$23 million for the 2023-24 year which the State Mandated Reserve is \$2 million.</p> <p>There are several funding sources that are unknown such as: Ongoing Expanded Learning Opportunity Program, one-time funding adjustments, Art and Music Block Grant, and the Learning Recovery Block Grant. Some risks involved with the MYB include declining enrollment and the greatest risk is the uncertain future of the economy.</p> <p>Following no additional public comment, the Public Hearing was closed at 7:26 p.m.</p>
<p>Public Hearing: Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)</p>	<p>Board President Hanson declared an open public meeting at 7:26 p.m. for comment on the District’s Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP).</p> <p>Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services Dr. Marcie Poole provided an overview of the 2023-24 LCAP draft for the District. She outlined the background and purpose of the LCAP, which aims to increase student success. For each of the five goals, a review of the ongoing services was reviewed: Goal #1 – ELA & Math, Goal #2 – Financial Solvency, Goal #3 – Student Engagement & School Climate, Goal #4 – Family Engagement, and Goal #5 – Professional Development. She reviewed highlights, identified the areas of need, went over the timeline and thanked everyone for their feedback and assistance with completing the LCAP.</p> <p>Following no additional public comment, the Public Hearing was closed at 7:53 p.m.</p>



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the La Habra City School District welcomes all comments made respectfully to the La Habra City School District school board, following public comment guidelines, to ensure the District meets its duty to provide all community members the opportunity to share both their concerns and their complements;
