RESOLUTION OF THE LA HABRA CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT GOVERNING BOARD DETERMINING STEPS TO ENSURE AVAILABILITY OF TEXTBOOKS

AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS FOR 2016-2017

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 60119 establishes steps and procedures to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials in order to be eligible to receive funds for that purpose, and;

WHEREAS, the procedures require that school districts take appropriate action to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials on a yearly basis, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Sections 60119, the Board is required to hold a public hearing to encourage participation by parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the school district, and bargaining unit leaders, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to provide 10 days' notice of the public hearing or hearings, and;

WHEREAS, the notice shall contain the time, place, and purpose of the hearing and be posted in three public places within the school district, and;

WHEREAS, the hearing shall be held at a time that will encourage the attendance of teachers and parents and guardians of pupils who attend the schools in the district and shall not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing Board of a school district, as part of the required hearing, shall also make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board for those subjects, and;

WHEREAS, the governing Board shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, and;

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on September 22, 2016, at 7:00 p.m., which is on or before the eighth week of school and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to make a determination, through a resolution, as to whether each pupil in each school in the district has, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code 33126 in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board:

(i) Mathematics,

- (ii) Science,
- (iii) History-social science,
- (iv) English/language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program,
- (v) Visual and performing arts. (Not listed in 60605 or 33126)

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing Board makes the determination that each pupil of the district, has available sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code Section 33126 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board and adopted by this Board in accordance with the procedures as established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2016-2017 school year, the La Habra City School District, has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code Section 33126 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board for those subjects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2016-2017 school year, the School District has provided sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board, to each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course, and that sufficient laboratory science equipment applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, is available to pupils.

Results

Background:

<u>Parent Surveys</u> - Each spring, La Habra City School District surveys all parents of students in the district through the use of the "Title I Parent Survey." Additionally, parents of students learning English are asked to complete the "EL Parent Survey." Both surveys are sent home with students and parents have the opportunity to complete both on-line. We received 1,979 responses to our Title I Parent Survey and 770 replies to the EL Parent Survey. These response rates represented almost 40% of each population surveyed. While parents were given the option of completing the surveys on-line, the majority returned paper copies. *K-12 Insight* analyzed the data and provided District and School-wide results.

Organizational and Planning Survey – Since 2010, La Habra City School District has provided teaching staff the opportunity to provide input in the District's Organization and Planning in May for the following year. The Organizational and Planning Survey is completed anonymously on-line. *K12 Insight* analyzed the data and provided District-wide and Schoolwide results. The survey is designed to gauge perceptions regarding a variety of key issues in the school district.

Rationale:

<u>Parent Surveys</u> – La Habra City School District Board Policies, as well as federal regulations, require Title I programs, activities, and procedures are developed and agreed upon with parents/guardians of participating students. In addition, parents of English learners should be notified of their rights, student placement, student progress, and opportunities to actively participate in their child's education. The surveys provide valuable information regarding parent involvement, suggested parent training, and their connection to LHCSD schools. Information gathered from survey responses also informs the development of each school sites' Single Plan for Student Achievement and the District's Local Control and Accountability Plan and LHCSD's Local Educational Agency Plan.

<u>Organizational and Planning Survey</u> – Results assist site administrators in refining their practices and guide District staff in planning professional development opportunities for both staff and parents.

Re: Resolution in support of Proposition 51 \$9 Billion State School Bond

Background:

The last statewide school facilities bond was passed by California voters in 2006, there currently is a backlog of almost \$2 billion in K-12 project applications and almost \$500 million in priority community college projects. With estimates projecting that K-14 schools will need \$20 billion over the next decade to complete renovations and build new schools where there is growth, Prop 51 will provide \$9 billion in matching state grant funds to help school districts meet future needs.

Many schools and community colleges are outdated and need repairs to meet basic health and safety standards and upgrade facilities to meet modern student education needs—including science labs, improved school technology, and facilities that support career technical education programs in both community colleges and K-12 schools. Prop 51 will help make sure local schools are updated and safe for students.

Local district support for this bond is more important this year than ever before. In the past, political coalitions have been organized before the statewide measure was placed on the ballot. This is because both the Legislature and the Governor needed to reach agreement in order to garner the two-thirds vote of the Legislature required to place the measure on the ballot. This year is different. Both major political parties have endorsed Proposition 51, but this measure was qualified through the initiative process and has not been voted on by the Legislature. That means that districts and school facility advocacy organizations must organize their own "grass roots" campaign. This will be a contested election, the outcome of which is critical to the success of education reform in California. It is not enough to simply restore prior operating budget cuts, leaving most California schools well below the national average funding level. Students and teachers also need facilities that are competitive with those in other states.

Rationale:

La Habra City School District has \$31 million in facilities construction and modernization needs, some of which could come from the proceeds of these state bonds. The first project in line would be the completion of Walnut Elementary School modernization. Board Approval of a Resolution in support of Proposition 51 a \$9 Billion state School Bond measure on the November 8th ballot would support the La Habra City School District facilities needs.

Recommended Action:

Approval of Resolution in support of Proposition 51 \$9 Billion State School Bond

Financial Implications, if any:

If Proposition 51 passes there is a potential to receive \$2 Million in 2017-18 to support modernization at Walnut School, other potential support of modernization and construction not quantified at this time.

La Habra City School District Proposition 51 – Resolution #21-2016 Kindergarten through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016

WHEREAS, the California Constitution finds public education is a State responsibility in Article IX Section 5; and

WHEREAS, Article 1 Section 28 states that public schools shall be safe, secure and peaceful; and

WHEREAS, the State has met its constitutional responsibilities since 1982 by providing consistent State bond resources through programs contained in Division 1, Part 10, Article 12 and Article 12.5 of the Education Code; and

WHEREAS, the State is out of school facility funds and cannot provide the State match for almost \$2 billion in projects filed under current law; and

WHEREAS, the La Habra City School District has \$31 Million in facility need which may be partially funded by State bond; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 51 - the Kindergarten through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016 - provides for renovation and upgrade of existing classrooms, construction of new classrooms to accommodate growth, and for career technical education facilities to provide job training to meet the trained workforce needs of California's employers; and

WHEREAS, the California unemployment rate is greater than the national unemployment rate; and

WHEREAS, 13,000 middle class jobs are created for each \$1 billion in school facility infrastructure investment; and

WHEREAS, these jobs will be created throughout California and will include almost all building trades; and

WHEREAS, the new Local Control Funding Formula and Local Control Accountability Plan are intended to improve educational achievement for all students but do not provide dedicated facilities funding; and

WHEREAS, quality 21st Century school facilities designed for student needs of today

and tomorrow enhance academic achievement and further the State's academic goals; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 51 - the Kindergarten through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016 - will not raise State taxes; and

WHEREAS, the Proposition 51 - Kindergarten through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016 - State matching funds will reduce the need for additional local property taxes for school facilities.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the La Habra City School District support Proposition 51 – the Kindergarten through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016.
