What is the difference between the Virtual and Hybrid Learning Models?



In Virtual learning, students do not physically come to school. All of their learning takes place remotely.

Hybrid



In Hybrid learning, students spend part of their time in the physical school setting and part of their time learning from home.



Students attend school remotely in the morning with a combination of direct instruction, small-group and independent work.

Hybrid

In Hybrid learning, students attend school in-person in the morning or afternoon for direct instruction with their teacher. The remaining instructional minutes are completed at home.




How can you help your child be successful?

Set Structures and Expectations for at-home learning



Set a **daily schedule** for your children

- School time
- Break/Play/Outdoor time
- Snack/Lunch time

Be **flexible**

- Children should not be sitting for four straight hours. Break schoolwork up into smaller chunks of time.
- Your children may need more/less time to complete a task than what the teacher suggested.
- The younger your child is, the more often they need to move.

Set Structures and Expectations for at-home learning



Set boundaries for appropriate and inappropriate behaviors. Follow through with expected consequences.

- Establish "quiet time" for school work.
- Expect your child to follow "school rules" regarding appropriate use of technology and digital citizenship.
- Outdoor movement and playtime should not be a consequence kids need movement and brain breaks to help them focus and learn.

- 1. What did you do today that made you think hard?
- 2. What happened today that made you keep on going?
- 3. What can you learn from this?
- 4. What mistake did you make that taught you something?
- 5. What did you try hard at today?
- 6. What strategy are you going to try now?
- 7. What will you do to challenge yourself today?
- 8. What will you do to improve your work?
- 9. What will you do to improve your talent?
- 10. What will you do to solve this problem?
